MODULE #4 WORKSHEET Plastic Pollution

BE AN INVESTIGATIVE REPORTER

1. Research: Ask your parents, grandparents, even your great grandparents how they managed without plastic wrap, or plastic grocery bags, or plastic bottles. What kind of toys did they have? What did they take their lunch to school in? How did they wrap up their sandwich? What did they use instead of plastic water bottles? What did they put their leftover food in, to store in the refrigerator? How about plastic forks and spoons? What about their shoes? What



about bottles of shampoo and lotions and things like that in the bathroom? How about bottles of cleaning products for the kitchen?

Here is an example of a few things. But this list can be VERY long. It's fun to get an idea of what other generations did 40 to 50 years ago. Start your list with these ideas and interview your family.
